

List of Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs) Table Instructions

Chemicals often have more than one name. A Chemical Abstracts Services (CAS) number is unique to each chemical.

Searching for HAPs by CAS Number:

The only chemicals on the HAPs list without CAS Numbers are some grouped chemicals (compounds). These would come up with a search by name.

#1 Use the Find Key.

Highlight a cell in the column of CAS numbers, then click on Edit in the toolbar at the top of the page. From the drop down menu, choose the binoculars for Find. Type in a CAS # and click on Find Next. If your search finds it, it is a HAP.

#2 Use the Sort function.

Click on Data in the toolbar at the top of the page. From the drop down menu, choose Sort. Then choose to sort by Chemical Abstracts Services Number.

Searching for HAPs by Name

If you check for a chemical according to its name and it does not show up, you can double check according to its CAS number.

#1 Use the Find Key.

Highlight a cell in the column of HAP names, then click on Edit in the toolbar at the top of the page. From the drop down menu, choose the binoculars for Find. Type in a name and click on Find Next. If your search finds it, it is a HAP.

#2 Use the Sort function.

Click on Data in the toolbar at the top of the page. From the drop down menu, choose Sort. Then choose to sort by HAP Name.
