



Facts about Standardized Compliance Plan Language

Air Quality/Permit Information/#2.18/December 2003

The following are lists of requirements or lists of categories for which the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) Air Quality Staff has developed standardized Compliance Plan language. You may use these lists as a time-saving device when you fill out your Compliance Plan (CD-01) forms. If your facility is subject to any of

the requirements on these lists, you can simply write "Use standardized language for ..." and then the description of the appropriate requirement, on the CD-01 form. For example, if your facility is portable, and you are required to submit Relocation Notification Forms, you would fill out the second page of the CD-01 form for your Entire Facility as follows:

If you are concerned that the standardized language will not fit your specific needs, you may contact the MPCA Customer Assistance Center at (651) 297-2274 or (800)646-6247 (within Minnesota) to get copies of the language for your review. In most cases, the language follows the wording of the particular rule or requirement.

Most of these requirements belong in every air emission permit:

- Circumvention
- Shutdowns
- Breakdowns
- Deviations Notifications
- Operation of Pollution Control Equipment

- Fugitive Emissions Control Plan
- Comply With Fugitive Control Plan
- Portable Sources: Relocation Notification Form
- Portable Sources: Locations Authorized to Operate
- Application for Permit Reissuance (State Permit)
- Application for Permit Reissuance (Part 70 Permit)
- Application for Permit Amendment
- Submittal Extension Requests
- Records of Insignificant Modification or Changes Contravening Permit Terms
- Compliance Schedule Progress Report
- Semiannual Deviations Report
- Compliance Certification
- Records Retention
- Noise
- General Conditions
- Permit Shield (Request that Requirement Does Not Apply)
- Inspection Access
- Emission Inventory
- Emission Fees
- Risk Management Program (40 CFR pt. 68)

Performance Testing

These requirements belong in any permit for a facility that is required to do performance testing (specify either recurring or non-recurring testing):

- Performance Test
- Performance Test Notification and Submittals
- Performance Test Frequency Plan

In addition to these standardized requirements, the MPCA has developed template language for the following categories of requirements. These are less frequently used and may need to be modified on a case-by-case basis, so the actual lists of requirements are not reproduced here.
